Demonstrative Adjectives and Pronouns

- You use **demonstrative adjectives** to point out specific things and to show the distance between the speaker and the item.
- Demonstrative pronouns** are used in place of the adjective and noun. Their forms are the same as demonstrative adjectives, but they have an **accent** over the first **e**.

	masculine singular	masculine plural	feminine singular	feminine plural
this, these <i>near the speaker</i>	este éste	estos éstos	esta ésta	estas éstas
that, those <i>near the person spoken to</i>	ese ése	esos ésos	esa ésa	esas ésas
that, those <i>not associated with either the speaker or the person spoken to</i>	aquel aqué	aquellos aqué	aquella aqué	aquellas aqué

- Remember that **demonstrative adjectives** and **pronouns** agree in gender and number with the nouns to which they refer.

Regina: **Esta** novela me gustó mucho.
*I liked **this** novel very much.*

Carolina: Sí, **ese** libro es excelente.
*Yes, **that** book is excellent.*

- Remember that there are also **demonstrative pronouns** that refer to ideas or unidentified things that do not have a specific gender.

esto eso aquello

Don't put an **accent** mark on these words.

—Marcos faltó otra vez.
Marcos was absent again.

—**Esto** me preocupa.
***This** worries me.*
