

Singular	Plural
me (me)	nos (us)
Te (you) fam.	os (you) fam.
Lo (it, him, you)	Los (them, you)
La (it, her, you)	Las (them, you)

About Direct Object Pronouns:

- A direct object tells who or what receives the action of the verb.
- DOP always go before the conjugated verb or attached to the infinitive.
- To avoid repeating a direct object noun you replace it with a direct object pronoun.
- *Lo, la, los* and *las* can refer to **both** objects and people.
- *me, te, nos* and *us* refer to **only** people.

Direct Object Pronouns

Ejemplos:

Maria come los tacos.

Maria los come.

Maria los va a comer.

Maria va a comerlos.

¿Me quieres? Si, te quiero mucho.

¿Nos trae la cuenta por favor?
